# From the Chairman

2023/24 has been an amazing season for our club a very successful one. Men's D1 made the finals playoffs for the first time in 8 seasons by finishing 2nd at the end of the minor round and then unfortunately losing in both finals series we played in, much satisfaction should be taken from this great result. This team also saw Drew Janssen awarded as the Capps Medallist as the Most Valuable Player for the D1 competition and also a team of the year selection and pitching award, the first Woodville Player to do since Tony Harris won the medal in 1987, 37 years ago. An outstanding coaching effort from club life member Lawrie Moore who also took out the BSA Coach of the Year award. Wade Moore celebrated a milestone of 500 games, along with Nathan Nicholson playing his 600th game, well done guys.

The Men's Div 2 team again performed well and also made finals, eventually losing the preliminary final to the strong H&G side. Some great efforts, Joe Papps being in the Top 5 BSA MVP awards and again thanks to Ryan Muggleton & Daniel Chapman for coaching the side to their second successive finals appearance.

Women's Div 1 unfortunately didn't repeat their outstanding premiership win from the previous year but again performed very well, making the finals and being knocked out by eventual premier Sturt. Well done to Amara Quinn & Alyssa Lasscock for their selections in the SA Women's team for the National championships, unfortunately for Alyssa a season ending knee injury put pay to a trip to Melbourne in April, a big thanks for Todd Dunstall for again stepping up to coach this team.

Women's Div 2 narrowly missed the finals, had a great season and thoroughly enjoyed themselves, some new players started to really learn the game, and some young players really shone through a great overall team effort a big thanks to Shane Brown & Breandan Taheny for your work with this team and Dave Ding for stepping up when needed throughout the year.

Div3 Men's went well again, unlucky to not be in finals but very competitive again and enjoyed their season, thanks again to Dave Lodge for your great efforts in coaching. Div 6 Men's very competitive this year and won 4 games and finally got off the bottom of the ladder, some great individual performances particularly with Shane Brown who played his 700th game for the club, coach Tim Fawcett played his 400th game. Really proud of this team and a great bunch of guys to coach and play with.

Div 7 Blue again enjoyed the usual banter that these great club guys deliver, first time in missing finals in 7 years hurt them a bit, but again super competitive and just narrowly missed out thanks to all this team for what you bring to the club, a fantastic group well coached by Vladamir Marsland and Behr. Div 7 red also very competitive and a real mix of experience and many relatively inexperienced players all went well and hoping to see many back next year, thanks to Shane Lodge in your efforts coaching this team.

So, the season wrapped up with 3 senior teams making finals, Men's D1&2, and Women's D1 and all the others highly competitive, and more senior players registered than we have had in a very long time. I am also hearing really good things of previous juniors wanting to return and play senior baseball next season with us. And with our club fielding U17 team for the first time in several years we have a genuine pathway to senior baseball for this group.

Onto our Juniors, again also an amazing season for our junior teams. 4/5 possible teams making finals, fielding 6 Junior teams and having over 80 registered junior players we are building a really great culture and community feel within the club. We got 3 of these teams to the Grand Finals and unfortunately didn't get the chocolates on the day but the future is super bright if we keep getting this success.

We had two MVP medal winners Archie Wallis for LL D2 and Alice Brown for JL D1, an outstanding effort on reflection being one of only 3 female players in the top tier comp of the JL U15 competition, Ollie Hayes and Diesel Fallon also came 2nd & 3rd in the Senior League D2 MVP votes and both participated in Senior baseball at the club, with Ollie making his D1 debut in the final round and also representing SA in the U16 National competition in January, these players and their families trek every week from Mildura to our club a very inspirational and dedicated group of people who I hope will have a long association with our club.

In mid-April we had large numbers of junior players representing the Western Rays in the State Charter competition-SL Diesel Fallon, JL Rays-Alice Brown, Chace Wallis and Will Stock, LL Rays-Archie Wallis and Feilx Oliver and LL Development-Kylah Ding, Riley Sinclair, Myles Braithwaite, Bodhi Ansell and Ely Plaves, no less than 11 reps from our club, something we should be super proud of.

Then, the impossible happened our Youth Women's Team won the Gold Medal at the National Championships in early April, only the second time SA has entered a team. Our Woodie Girls-Indie O'Hazy-Zschorn, Dakota Ding and Alice Brown all performed exceptionally well during the tournament, with Alice taking out the tournament MVP and Golden Arm award whilst guiding her team to an all game pitching effort to win the gold, truly outstanding girls our club is so proud of what you have achieved.

Finally, I thank our board members who work tirelessly for our club and personally give me great support, it is very much appreciated and to all our players, supporters, members and life members we are really onto something special and have made huge steps from where we were 5-6 years ago to where we are now, keep the faith and keep supporting the mighty Senators. A great bunch of people!!

Congrats also to **Lawrie Moore** on being name **Coach of the Year** – you did a fabulous job mate.

**Division 1 Women.** It was always going to be difficult for these women to follow the previous year's Premiership triumph! Todd Dunstall somewhat reluctantly took the reins again and was greeted with setbacks which included Carly Moore being infrequently available due to her new FIFO career, Taylor McKay releasing back to her beloved Reds, Ashleigh George's unavailability and nagging injuries to star players Darna and Meggsie Boers-Veen. An overwhelming family tragedy also befell members of the team early in 2024. The ladies battled on bravely however, having several good wins and unearthing a new star on the mound in Amara Quinn, who finished 4th in the medal count. Congrats to **Alyssa Lasscock** (Golden Glove Infielder) and **Sarah McMahon** for making the **Team of the Year**.

We can look forward to an exciting year next year, with our younger brigade joining the WD1 ranks, along with newly named Head Coach Shane Brown, and other people also joining the Club.

There were also several injuries throughout the ladies' ranks and at times WD2 struggled to field a full side. On top of this, they had to play against a few sides that really should have been in Div 1.

Nevertheless Shane, with the help of Breandan and Julien, were always competitive and enjoyed the experience, only missing the playoffs by a couple of games.

**Division 3 Men** coached by David Lodge battled hard and had a lot of good wins during the year. Injuries and unavailability in the group and above in Div's 1 and 2 meant that some weeks the ranks were stretched very thin and subsequently lost touch with the finals a couple of weeks before the season ended.
